General Course

Students in the General Course take classes following junior high fundamental subjects, such as Japanese, social science, mathematics, general science, physical education, art, home economics, information technology, and English. We provide extra classes on Tuesdays and advanced classes on Saturdays for university entrance examination preparation.

Integrated Course

The integrated Course combines the best elements of the general and vocational courses. In the second year, the curriculum is divided into 4 separate courses – tourism, welfare, childcare and food culture. Students will choose one of these courses depending on his or her personal interest and desired career.

Tourism Course

Students acquire knowledge and skills of local tourism industries to learn how to contribute towards regional revitalization. In addition to tourism, this course offers classes about traditional culture and cross-cultural understanding. The students can take classes such as Business Tourism, Regional History, Hotel Manners & Management, and Geography.

Welfare Course

Students acquire knowledge and skills within the fields of health care, human welfare, and nursing, particularly for the elderly and people with disabilities. The goal is to contribute to a society in which every person stays healthy and lives a safe and comfortable life. We recommend this course to students who are interested in nursing and / or welfare work. The students can take classes such as Beginners' Caring, Beginners' Social Welfare, Nutrition, Home Care, and Welfare.

Childcare Course

Students acquire the knowledge and skills necessary in order to contribute to local community in the field of child rearing. We recommend this course to students who dream of becoming a kindergarten teacher or a childcare worker. Students can take classes such as Children's development & Childcare and Children's Culture and Welfare.

Food Culture Course

Students acquire knowledge and skills of food, cooking and food culture. We recommend this course to students who hope to work for the restaurant business in the future. We expect the students to boost local tourism and the local food distribution in the future. Students can take classes such as Food Design, Food Culture and Cooking.

Business & Information Technology Course

By studying commercial subjects, students can develop their talents to work as a business leader who will contribute to local economy in the future. In the second year, the curriculum is divided into 3 separate courses - Information Technology & Design, Accounting and Marketing. Students will choose depending on his or her personal interest and desired career.

Information Technology & Design course

Students can acquire knowledge and skills about marketing management and information technology. The students can deepen the understanding of marketing while obtaining qualifications related to a computer. Students can take classes such as Programing and E-commerce.

Accounting course

Students can acquire knowledge and skills of accounting to be a financial officer or a business consultant. The students can also learn how to utilize financial information at this course. The students can take classes such as Management Accounting and Cost Accounting.

Marketing course

Students can learn the fundamentals of economy and distribution. We expect the students to contribute to local business in the future through the product development experience at this course. The students can aim to pass Retail Marketing Examination. The students can take classes such as Product Development and Marketing.
