Our school symbol is a combination of letters, S and U. “S” is for Seki(関) and “U” is for Uchi(有知). “S” stands for the clear waters of Nagara River and a cormorant for Oze cormorant fishing. And the color “blue” stands for “youth” and “ideal”. “U” stands for the flame of passion and the spark by Japanese sword smith. And the color “red” stands for “passion” and “love”.
